

Dear Dr. Fine,

Our organization has been trying for over a year to get USABLE information from BAAQMD on Airborne Lead levels at Reid Hillview Airport. Last year, we completed a public records request and got the following useless response in a text format:



We were seeking information from the Reid Hillview Airport monitoring site for airborne lead levels - this is not it.

More recently, we met Mr. Yamaichi, a Senior AQIS, at San Martin Airport and asked him to forward another request for us. He copied us on his internal email but there has been no response to that either.

In a similar vein, the Santa Clara County Airport Commission has made numerous requests - written and verbal - for information from and/or a presentation by BAAQMD on the Airborne

Lead Study that your organization has conducted and, in particular, information on the airborne lead levels at Reid Hillview Airport since the institution of a ban on the sale of leaded aviation fuel. Nothing has been forthcoming from that request either.

It would appear that BAAQMD does not have any interest in providing the requested information to the public on this issue; however, **A NEW THREAT TO THE COMMUNITY IS AT HAND:** 

The VTA (Valley Transportation Agency) is about to begin construction on and around the Capitol Expressway in San Jose to extend the VTA Light Rail. This construction is planned to take place over the next four years and will involve disturbing soils that hold legacy lead and will most certainly distribute that lead into the air. Your agency is well aware of this hazard, but to reiterate the threat, here are the links to several studies that identify soils containing lead as a known source of airborne lead:

Strong evidence that legacy lead from pre-2000 time frame continues to be present in airborne lead samples.

Soil is the dominant lead source found in El Paso and Los Angeles <a href="https://journals.plos.org/plosone/article?id=10.1371/journal.pone.0005019">https://journals.plos.org/plosone/article?id=10.1371/journal.pone.0005019</a>

"X-ray absorption spectroscopy demonstrates that the source of the majority of the lead in PM in El Paso, and presumably in other US cities, is not current anthropogenic output. Instead, local contaminated soil, a legacy of earlier Pb releases, serves as a long-term reservoir that gradually is leaking particulate lead, much in the form of Pb-humate, to the atmosphere. Given the difficulty and expense of large-scale soil remediation or removal, this Pb-humate may establish a practical lower limit for airborne lead levels in many urban settings."

Lead-contaminated soils are an important source of lead burdens to urban populations https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/20173294/

It is for these reasons that the lead readings from you sites at Reid Hillview and surrounding areas taken over the past four years (or longer) are even more important - first as evidence of the baseline airborne lead levels, second as evidence of the reduction in airborne lead that has occurred as leaded aviation fuels were withdrawn from the airport, and finally to monitor and identify increased levels of airborne lead that will be released into the community during the lengthy construction process.

Time is of the essence. Your cooperation on providing this public data in a usable form should not pose an undue burden nor should it require an FOIA or other public records request.

We look forward to your expeditious response to our request.

#### 2.7 Actions Related to the AMS SJC JV Retail Concession Agreement.

#### **Recommendation:**

Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager or her designee to negotiate and execute one or more amendment(s) to the AMS SJC JV Retail Concession Agreement to:
(a) Place the AMS SJC JV Retail Concession Agreement for concession locations that expire on June 30, 2024, on a month-to-month holdover tenancy effective July 1, 2024; (b) Suspend the Minimum Annual Guarantee and allow the Concessionaire to pay a percentage of gross sales (Percentage Fee) on the two retail packages consolidated under the AMS SJC JV agreement for any period between January 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026; and (c) Revise the Percentage Fee categories in both retail packages to one consolidated Percentage Fee for the period between January 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026. CEQA: Not a Project, File No. PP17-005, Adjustment to Fees, Rate and Fares without changes to or expansion of services. (Airport)

The commission received an Air Services update at a recent meeting. Management was effusive over the expertise of the staff member handling the marketing of the airport. Yet, here we have a consulting contract of \$1 million awarded for Air Service Development.

2.7 Agreement with Avia Solutions, Inc. for Air Service Development Services at San José Mineta International Airport.

#### **Recommendation:**

Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager or her designee to negotiate and execute a Master Consultant Agreement with Avia Solutions, Inc. for Air Service Development Services at San José Mineta International Airport, for a period of five years from execution, in a total amount not to exceed \$975,000 over the term of the agreement. CEQA: Not a Project, File No. PP17-002, Consultant services for design, study, inspection, or other professional services with no commitment to future action. (Airport)

Finally, here we have another Re-bid of a major infrastructure project:

3.9 Action Related to the 10179 – SJC New Taxiway V-Phase 2 Project Re-Bid.

#### **Recommendation:**

- (a) Report on bids and award of a contract for the construction of 10179- SJC New Taxiway V-Phase 2 Project Re-Bid to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, A. Teichert & Son, Inc. dba Teichert Construction, for the base bid and Bid Alternate No. 1 in an amount of \$21,483,490.
- (b) Approve a 10% contingency in the amount of \$2,148,349.
- (c) Adopt the following 2024-2025 Funding Sources Resolution and Appropriation Ordinance amendments in the Airport Capital Improvement Fund:
