

LIST OF ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTS

Below is a list of acceptable documents which establish both identity and work authorization for the purpose of a Security Threat Assessment. Two forms of ID *must* be provided to the SJC Badging Office: a **List A plus a List B or List C** document; OR a **List B and a List C** document.

Documents that Establish Both Identity and Employment Eligibility
1. Unexpired U.S. Passport or U.S. Passport Card
2. Permanent Resident Card or Alien Registration Receipt Card (Form I-551)
3. Unexpired foreign passport, that contains a temporary I-551 stamp or temporary I-551 printed notation on a machine-readable immigrant visa.
4. Employment Authorization Document that contains a photograph (Form I-766)
5. In the case of nonimmigrant alien authorized to work for a specific employer incident to status, a foreign passport with Form I-94 or Form I-94A bearing the same name as the passport and containing an endorsement of the alien's nonimmigrant status, as long as the period of endorsement has not yet expired and the proposed employment is not in conflict with any restrictions or limitations identified on the form
6. Passport from the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM) or the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI) with Form I-94 or Form I-94A indicating nonimmigrant admission under the Compact of Free Association between the US and the FSM or RMI

Documents that Establish Identity
1. Driver's license or ID card issued by a State or outlying possession of the United States provided it contains a photograph or information such as name, date of birth, gender, height, eye color, and address
2. ID card issued by Federal, State, or local government agency or entity provided it contains a photograph or information such as name, date of birth, gender, height, eye color, and address
3. School ID card with a photograph
4. Voter's registration card
5. U.S. Military card or draft record
6. Military dependent's ID card
7. U.S. Coast Guard Merchant Mariner Card
8. Native American tribal document
9. Driver's license issued by a Canadian government authority
For persons under the age of 18 who are unable to present a document listed above:
1. School record or report card
2. Clinic, doctor, or hospital record
3. Day-care or nursery school record

Documents that Establish Employment Eligibility
1. Social Security Account Number card other than one that specifies on the face that the issuance of the card does not authorize employment in the United States (MUST NOT BE LAMINATED).
2. Certification of Birth Abroad Issued by the Department of State (Form FS-545)
3. Certification of Report of Birth issued by the Department of State (Form DS-1350)
4. Original or certified copy of a birth certificate issued by a State, county, municipal authority, or outlying possession of the United States bearing an official seal
5. Native American tribal document
6. U.S. Citizen ID Card (USCIS Form I-197)
7. ID Card for use of Resident Citizen in the United States (USCIS Form I-179)
8. Unexpired employment authorization document issued by USCIS (other than those listed under List A)

LIST OF ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTS – ADDENDUM

If the applicant is born outside of the US, they may either provide a LIST A document or they may provide one of the documents listed below along with a List B and List C document. The following documents are now acceptable for the purposes of the Security Threat Assessment (STA) only.

Individuals who are not U.S. citizens may provide:

1. Alien Registration Card + List B + List C document

U.S. Citizens born abroad or naturalized U.S. citizens may provide:

1. Certificate of Naturalization Number, (Form N-550 or N-470) + List B + List C document
2. Consular Report of Birth Abroad (Form FS-240) + List B + List C document
